GRAND KNIGHT'S REPORT:

Two (2) requests have been received, reviewed and each have received \$499.

TREASURER'S REPORT: (JAMES SMITH) Treasurer advised the Council of the most recent monthly bank account balance.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT: (PETER PERTA) Membership stands at 244. Dues collected for the 2019/2020 fraternal year stands at fifty (50%) percent, which is far below normal. The postponement of the Members Appreciation Dinner Dance and the suspension of Lenten Fish Fries and General Meetings have had a negative impact on dues collections. Peter will be mailing out notices to members who have yet to pay their 2019/2020 dues. He will include a note asking anyone who is in financial need to contact him about waiving this year's dues. Dues can be paid by credit card on-line. One of our members paid for multiple years; current and past overdue. Peter asked Jorge to post an on-line note reminding members to pay their dues.

BUDGET COMMITTEE (PETER PERTA)

We have been replaced/lost the Fall Football concessions. Spring Baseball concessions usually start in late February or early March. As of today, we do not have a firm start day. We know that our concessions income for the balance of the current fiscal year and going into the next fiscal year will be significantly reduced, we just do not know by how much.

The 2019/2020 budget (\$43,850) should have included, but did not, a Sacramental Gifts line item of \$3,500 (\$47,350). With the addition of \$3,500 for Sacramental Gifts to the 2019/2020 budget, the overall spending of the proposed 2020/2021 budget (\$48,000) is \$650 higher than the 2019/2020 budget. Peter highlighted that there will be some saving in the budgeted spending for 2019/2020, pointing to the Annual Members Dinner Dance, Officers & Directors Yearend Meeting, and Major Degree Expense. Spending to date stands at sixty-eight (68%) percent of budget. With less than two (2) months left in the 2019/2020 fiscal year it is clear actual spending will come in far below budget. 2019/2020 concessions (baseball and football combined) net profit after expenses was \$42,393. Under the circumstances, the 2020/2021 proposed budget will likely need to be amended/adjusted/reduced in response to an expected shortfall in concessions income.
