

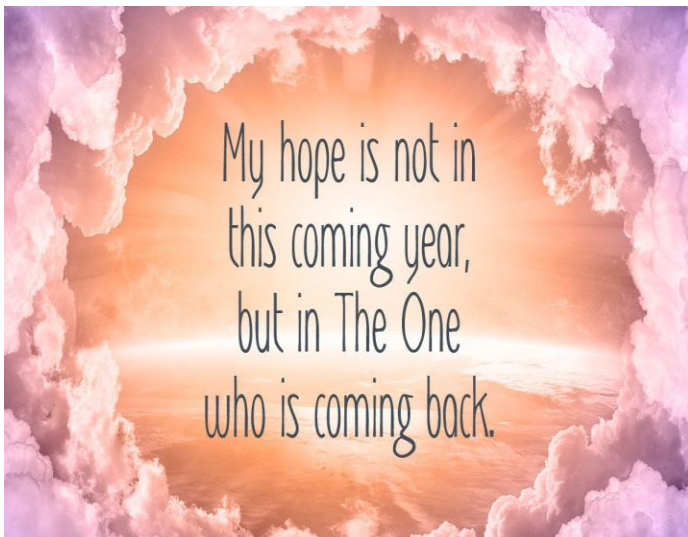

Let us begin with renewed hope and much prayer that the coming New Year finds us on our knees and back into the arms of Jesus with His Gospel at the center of the human heart for 'our sake and our salvation' where it belongs.

"A generation comes, and a generation goes, but the earth remains forever. "The sun rises and the sun goes down and hastens back to where it rises."

For the past 2,000 years, Christians have known that our main task in this brief earthly life is the transformation and salvation of souls: our own soul, all souls; the souls of the poor, middle and upper classes, the souls of all colors and races, the souls of both genders, the souls of the young and the old, and the souls of the infirm and healthy. None of us are sin free, and none because of their race or social position is beyond redemption. We stand for justice and mercy, not revenge and hatred.

For those who think they are caught between a disappearing and utopian past and a modern-day anxious and frightful future, come back to Jesus; He has a happier and everlasting future awaiting you. “[N]ow the spirit expressively says that in the later days some will depart from the faith by giving heed to deceitful spirits and doctrines of demons, through the pretensions of liars whose consciences are seared.”

its main sacrament. But just thinking something is true doesn’t make it so. One may think he is a bird “trapped” in a human body, but try flying with human arms and see how high you soar!

We Knights of Columbus believe in upholding the Culture of Life. It is a practice of supporting life from the ‘womb to the tomb.’ A culture of love and support for those at the dawn of life – the yet born and the newly born; children before the age of reason; the infirm; those who are elderly and in the twilight of life; and all who are suffering and deprived of humanity. We believe all Christians must be involved in the salvation of souls throughout the world. We believe in living by example to spread the Gospel of Christ through knowledge of scripture, church tradition and especially through works of charity to our fellow man. We believe in these ways and that the New Year will truly be a year of renewal of our faith and renewed victories in the fight for the salvation of souls.
